Are you looking for an inexpensive hobby that will reduce stress and benefit your wardrobe? Dust off that sewing machine and come learn or re-learn what to do with it! It is expected that as students progress, they will be bringing their own supplies, and project materials. It is helpful to have your own basic sewing tools, a good pair of sewing shears, and small embroidery scissors or quick clips. If you are planning a specific project please bring the pattern and an old sheet or muslin and the fabric you plan to use. Halsey Fabrics is a few blocks from the Newark Museum. They do not carry patterns. If you are bringing clothing that requires alterations, please bring that along for the first class. If you would like to learn to sew, or want to jumpstart your rusty skills, let me know and I'll bring a pattern for a basic jacket.
