#### Printed, handwoven, appliqué, 2007

Digital print from an original drawing, on treated silk, pieced and appliquéd onto wool/rayon, machine stitched, cut into strips, rewoven in an inlay technique with a cotton ground and a rayon tie-down thread.



#### Survivor

Printed, handwoven, 2008

Original photo, digital inkjet print on treated silk habotai, cut into strips, rewoven in an inlay technique with a cotton ground and a rayon tie-down thread.



#### Watching Death Come

Printed, handwoven, 2007

Digital print from an original drawing, on treated silk, cut into strips, rewoven in an inlay technique with a cotton ground and a rayon tie-down thread.



#### Margaret

Printed, handwoven, 2008

Digital inkjet prints on treated silk, cut into strips, rewoven in an inlay technique with a cotton ground and a rayon tie-down thread. Bamboo sticks.



### Rest in Peace Diptych

Printed, handwoven, 2010

Digital inkjet prints on treated silk habotai, from two photos taken August 2001, on a family vacation to NYC. Images were cut into strips, and rewoven in an inlay technique, cotton ground with synthetic thread. Binder spine.

Digital inkjet print on treated silk habotai, from a family photo. Cut into strips and rewoven in an inlay technique, linen ground with synthetic thread.



#### No Fear

Printed, handwoven, 2011

Digital inkjet print on treated cotton, from a family photo. Cut into strips and rewoven in an inlay technique, linen ground with synthetic thread.



# Still Life

Printed, handwoven, 2014

Digital inkjet print on treated cotton, from an artwork created in 1974 from ColorAid Paper. Cut into strips and rewoven in an inlay technique, linen ground with synthetic thread.



#### Personal Post Series: The Spouse Printed, handwoven, 2008-2010

Digital inkjet print on treated silk habotai, from original photograph, cut into strips, rewoven in an inlay technique, handwoven cotton ground with synthetic thread.
