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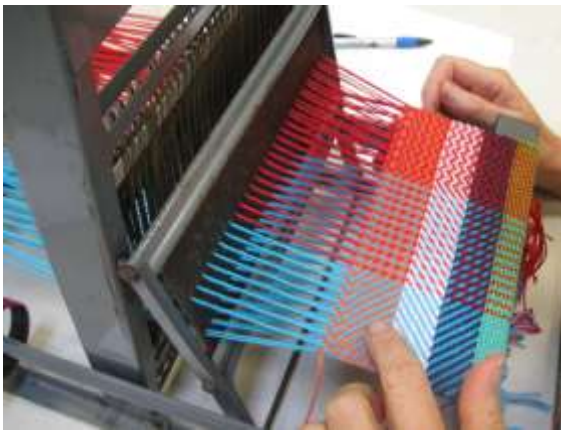
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WEAVE YOUR OWN CLOTH ON A FOUR SHAFT LOOM

1 Day Workshop



Explore this time honored craft, on a loom that allows patterning and play. Designed for beginners, and using colorful carpet warp, this workshop will take students through the warping process and teach them to understand patterning, reading a draft, color interaction, and how to weave a competent cloth. Plain weave, twills, rib and basket structures, and color and weave will be covered. All materials will be provided and students may take home their sampler.

KIT/MATERIALS FEE: \$15.00 Includes warp and weft yarn and handout

MAXIMUM ENROLLMENT: 16 Note: I can only offer this class if I am driving to the facility from NJ

SKILL LEVEL: All levels especially beginners

SUPPLY LISTS: Facility should provide enough tables to accommodate 16 small table looms. (Two students per table ideal)

STUDENTS SHOULD BRING: Scissors, notebook and pen.
